We're heading into that time of year where teachers and students alike start to feel the pressure to show what they know. Many teachers use strategies, like R.A.C.E., to help students learn how to construct an answer to a question that is supported by evidence. This is a skill that students can use throughout their educations and their lives.

VTS has some natural connections to this process. Afterall, don't we regularly ask the question: What did you see that makes you say that? To introduce (or to begin a review) of writing constructed responses, consider using artwork or other visual sources as your common "text" for initial practice of a constructed response strategy...

Remember to choose your image carefully. questions continue to be part of this process. The use of the VTS questions reminds students that they already a have a successful thinking strategy to support their to a written text by simply substituting "read" for "see" in the questions!
